## **About Reverie**

When we had our initial R&D of the project we were fascinated by ideas and archetypes found in Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland*. The work is very rich in metaphorical meanings but also in aesthetic and visual ideas. While working on the piece we realised we wanted to deviate from the actual story and keep some symbols found in it.

Through studying and looking at metaphors found in Alice we became interested in Carl Jung's theory of the collective unconscious, which according to Jung is common to all human beings, inherited from the past collective experience of humanity. It is a collection of knowledge and imagery common to all humankind and expressed through universal archetypes (signs, symbols, or patterns of thinking and behaving that are inherited from our ancestors). These ideas fascinated us and inspired our research when making the work.

Through the manipulation and moulding of these ideas we ended up dealing with time, memories and the way they keep returning through our subconscious.

In *Reverie* we are exploring time and memories in relation to reality and dreams. We are interested in the way the subconscious works: How do we remember the past in our present?

Memories and past experiences become autonomous and often eliminate faces and appearances. The world of memories and dreams becomes a fantasy world.

Our narrative is not linear, there are stories and images hidden in one another, playing with the idea of mind power. A dream becomes a nightmare and vice versa, and the only thing that keeps going is time. We hope that you might make associations through our characters' journeys and recognise some of your own emotions in it.

## **Georgia Tegou**

Georgia Tegou's choreographic work has been presented and supported by Arts Council England, Dance Umbrella, The Venice Biennale of Architecture, Onassis Stegi, Sadler's Wells, The Greek National Opera, The Place, ZfinMalta National Dance Company, Studio Wayne McGregor, Royal Academy of Music, The Whitechapel Gallery, Athens and Epidaurus Festival amongst others. She has choreographed two music videos for Róisín Murphy. Tegou was awarded a OneDanceUK Choreographers Observership and worked with Royal Opera House movement director and choreographer, Kate Flatt. In 2021 she was invited to exhibit a performative installation at the 17th International Architecture Exhibition / La Biennale di Venezia hosted by the Cyprus Pavilion co-directed with Michalis Theophanous. She was a Choreodrome 2021 artist at The Place, a Studio Light Moves / Open Futures resident artist at Dance Limerick and she is currently an artist in residence at Somerset House Exchange.

## **Michalis Theophanous**

Michalis Theophanous is a movement artist. He has a longstanding collaboration with the Greek choreographer Dimitris Papaioannou, appearing in *Inside* (2011), *Primal Matter* (2013 – a duet with Papaioannou), *Still Life* (2014) and *Transverse Orientation* (2021). In recent years, he has also collaborated closely with the American theatre director Robert Wilson, starring with Lucinda Childs in *Adam's Passion* (2015 – music by Arvo Pärt), and *Oedipus Rex* (2018). As a performer, Theophanous has worked with numerous choreographers, companies and organisations, including the Hellenic Dance Company (GR), Carte Blanche (NO), Konstantinos Rigos (GR), the National Theatre of Greece, and the Theatre Organisation of Cyprus (THOC). His work has been presented at Dance Umbrella, the Festival of Teatro Olimpico in Vicenza, Onassis Stegi in Athens, the Napoli Teatro Festival and elsewhere, with support from Arts Council England, Change Performing Arts and the University of Roehampton, London amongst others.

#### **Nathan Goodman**

Nathan Goodman studied Dance at the BRIT School (2002-2006), then went on to train at London Contemporary Dance School graduating in 2009. Nathan joined Richard Alston Dance Company in 2009 until 2014. Since then he has become a freelance artist and has worked with Arthur Pita & Headspacedance, Hofesh Shechter, Wayne McGregor, Chisato Minamimura, Fevered Sleep, Rosie Kay Dance Dance Company, Anna Watkins (Tavaziva Dance) and Shobana Jeyasingh Dance.

#### William James (JJ)

William James (JJ) grew up in Bristol, and at 16 went on to attend Rambert School where he graduated with a first class degree. He then joined the postgraduate company of VERVE, forming part of the 2022 cohort. Since graduating he has worked with choreographers such as Jose Agudo, Susan Kempster, Alessandra Seutin and Sita Ostheimer.

### **Synne Maria Lundesgaard**

Synne Maria Lundesgaard is a Norwegian dance artist. Having finished her BA(Hons) at The Place, London Contemporary Dance School, she now works internationally as a dancer, choreographer and producer. She is interested in how movement allows us to reimagine and redefine the body. She has worked with choreographers Holly Blakey, Rick Nodine, Seke Chimutengwende, Joe Moran, Helder Seabra amongst others.

## Virginia Poli

Virginia Poli moved from Tuscany to London aged 19, to graduate from Trinity Laban with a First Class Honours Degree (2018). Later, she was a company member of Transitions Dance Company (2018-2019) and worked with choreographers such as Laura Engholm (Engholm Danseteater, DNK), Tommy Cattin - Erem Dance (CH), Giulia Paoli (Italy), Maxine Doyle (UK). She's also the co-founder of VI.SA. Dance Project alongside Sara Maurizi, with whom she created the duet (R)esistentia, premiered at the Umbria Danza Festival in Perugia, Italy (2022) in partnership with HOME Centro Coreografico and Dance Gallery. The collective was awarded the DYCP grant by the Arts Council England.
